the first time her farm's wool has gone for spinning and Gail is going to Orange to watch the process.


Jane: Has nearly finished knitting the brown cardigan. She also showed socks and neck scarf knitted using

Jill: Scarf from handspun singles.


Vivian: Felted country style hat - red, yellow and black.

Ply	Times Round Ruler	Needle Size	
	per 2 inches	Bands	Body
4	30	12 (2.75mm)	10 (3.25mm)
5	28	11 (3mm)	9 (3.75mm)
8	24	10 (3.25mm)	8 (4mm)
12	20	8 (4mm)	5 (5.5mm)
14	18	7 (4.5mm)	3 (6.5mm)

Sometimes, if wool is fluffy or bulks up, a one-size smaller pattern is required to give correct size.
